Urgent Support Needed for Troops Deployed to European Theater

As troops continue to deploy in response to the invasion of Ukraine, Soldiers' Angels needs your immediate support to continue to provide aid, comfort, and resources to the service members that have been called to respond.

The invasion into Ukraine marks a moment in history that most of us believed we would never see (or never see again) in our lifetime— the start of war in the European theater. Thousands of American service members have been called to countries like Germany, Poland, Latvia, and Maldova to provide assistance to our European allies.

Soldiers' Angels are in urgent need of care package items in order to keep up with the increase in requests for support. They are also in need of <u>financial donations</u> to help cover the cost of shipping care packages and other items.

A donation of \$25 will ship a care package to a deployed service member, a donation of \$70 will ship 5 to 6 care packages in one large master box and a donation of \$300 will ship an entire pallet of snacks, hygiene, and more.

Below is a sample list of needed items for care packages or you can also shop their Amazon Wish List and have items sent directly to our warehouse.

Hygiene Items: Deodorant; Toothpaste, Toothbrush, Shampoo/Conditioner, Body Wash, Wet Wipes, Female Hygiene Products, Hand Warmers, Manicure Set, Back Scratchers, Socks (no tube socks), Hand Sanitizer, Cleaning Cloths/Spray (for glasses/goggles)

Snack Items: Protein Bars, Jerky or Meat Sticks, Sunflower Seeds, Freeze-Dried Fruit (Single Serve), Single-Serve Peanut Butter or Nutella, Single-Serve Cereals (Boxes or Cups, no bags as they will crush easily), Pop-Tarts, Nuts/Trail Mix (Single Serve Preferred), Tuna Salad Kit w/Crackers, Chicken Salad Kit w/Crackers, Powdered Drink Mixes like Crystal Light or Sports Drinks (Single Serve), Gum, Candy.

Down-Time Items: Small Balls or Footballs, Puzzle Books, Travel-Sized Games, Coloring Books, Pens/Pencils, Colored Pencils, Pencil Sharpeners.

Please AVOID the following items as they will not be able to include them: No aerosols or sprays in cans, No Pork or Pork By-Products (Slim Jims are OK), Tobacco or Alcoholic Beverage Products, Bars of Soap, Anything packaged in glass, Sharp Objects (Knives, Tools, Safety Pins, etc.), Pornography or other culturally sensitive material, Bagged Potato Chips (they are too easily crushed), Unwrapped Candies, Nail Polish, Perfume or Cologne.

Resources For Spouses

Active-duty folks transition only once when the military career is finished. However, y'all, think about the spouse. She or he transitions with every move. Picking up stakes, relocating to a new location and establishing all sorts of new relationships. These may be friendships, churches, a whole plethora of things. Probably the hardest though, is the career.

Every working spouse has struggled through the maze of finding a new job when that move is made. A friend of mine is lucky. She is the spouse of a medical officer who never left BAMC. How unique is that. She was able to create her own marketing business and has successfully developed her business through the years.

Most are not that lucky. Every two to four years requires leaving employment and then attempting to pick up in the new location. Some are lucky in finding a new position that values the skills and experiences learned. Many though find positions that are not equivalent to the previous. Others are forced into a gap in employment since nothing is available. And then others must change careers just to keep things going. Such a waste!

Good news is here. There are resources for the asking to assist in these transitions. First let me praise the work of the US Chamber of Commerce's Hiring Our Heroes (HoH) and our own MOAA for the marvelous bounty of resources available. These websites www.moaa.org are both packed with programs, events, and resources. The HOH fellowship program offers networking and training through experiences with civilian companies. Among MOAA's resources is a mentorship program with American Corporate Partners. What wonderful opportunities to grow a career.

DoD has the Spouse Education and Career Opportunities (SECO) program. This was featured in the March 2022 edition of Military Officer (p. 30). The website https://myseco.militaryonesource.mil has a wealth of information and resources to assist the spouse.

Last, but not least, is the HoH's Military Spouse Professional Network (MSPN). To link with them checkout Facebook – Joint Base San Antonio – HOH Military Spouse Professional Network. This is a private FB group with over 2100 members and link with the resources available. Networking and educational events are posted. P.S. Job opportunities are also posted there. What a gold mine!

Help pass the word. Don't let the talent of spouses be wasted or sidelined. The talent must be valued- start today.
