Legislative Report

MOAA National has published their legislative goals for the 118th Congress. They are as follows:

- Compensation and Service-Earned Benefits
- Military Housing
- Health Care for Currently Serving and Retirees
- Health Care and Benefits for Veterans
- Service Families
- Survivors
- · Guard and Reserve

Go to the MOAA website, **www.MOAA.org** and click on the Advocacy tab to review them in detail.

While on the website, please go to the Legislative Action Center under the Advocacy tab, enter your information and, of course, make sure you indicate that you are part of Alamo Chapter TX16.

Take a moment to review the letters that MOAA has laid out for you and send them to your legislators. Among them is the supporting of Concurrent Receipt aka the Major Richard Star Act. Make sure the letter is sent to our two senators (Cruz & Cornyn) and then follow-up with a phone call to their offices. We must try and get it added to the Senate version of the 2025 NDAA.

The Texas legislature is still quiet though we are monitoring how our State National Guardsmen are faring with their deployment to the border. We also have some plans to make it easier for spouses of military members and newly minted veterans to become certified in their fields of specialty. More to come.

Lastly, we just went through the attempted assassination of a presidential candidate. There are many unanswered questions as to how this could have happened AND it most certainly shouldn't happen for any candidate. I have learned over the years that we can all disagree on various issues, but I also know that even if we disagree, we should talk the issues out without vitriol or violence.

Hopefully, we then can arrive at some type of compromise. It is up to both candidates and their surrogates to keep the temperature lowered as we move through the rest of this campaign and allow, we, the voters to select our next president to move the United States forward!



Speaker Bio - Jeff Fair



Jeff Fair recently departed the Greater San Antonio Chamber of Commerce as the Vice President of Economic Development. In this role, he was responsible for serving as a leading policy expert, strategist, and resource for important issues surrounding key regional industries including cybersecurity and IT, commercial space and aerospace, healthcare and bioscience, and advanced manufacturing. He was also the Greater Chamber lead for small business support, the startup ecosystem, international trade, and region-

Air Force Base following a 23-year as an US Army officer. During his service, Jeff served at the National Security Agency and United States Cyber Command in strategy and policy roles as well as in operational assignments for the agency. This included a year as a fellow in the agency director's office and time at Cyber Command's Commander's Action Group, a key group providing strategy and analysis for the commander's top priorities.

Prior to arriving at NSA, Fair's Army career included serving as a deputy brigade commander and personal intelligence advisor to the commander of US Forces in Korea. He deployed several times to various locations including Iraq, Afghanistan, and others. He was also an instructor at the National Intelligence University, teaching classes on analysis, strategy, and cybersecurity.

Fair has a B.A. from the Elliott School at George Washington University, an M.B.A. from Hawaii Pacific University, an M.P.A from the University of Washington's Evans School, an M.S. in Strategic Intelligence from the National Intelligence University and is doctoral candidate at the George Washington University's Trachtenberg School of Public Policy and Administration.

Transition Tips

Networking Through Volunteering

One of the biggest challenges that is addressed when I talk to those transitioning is "stepping outside" of the comfort zone and networking. You've been able to hide behind your uniform and the identity that it provides. Your current network is built into the microcosm of the military community that is very distinct from the civilian community. Now you have to consider how to create your network in civilian attire. We're not necessarily going to focus on what you're wearing. The focus is more on what you can do to get to know the community. This can also lead to job opportunities as you meet new people.

I met a pilot retiree who had an eye-opening discussion with someone he met at church. He mentioned that he was retiring and trying to figure out his path. She suggested that he contact HEB, our San Antonio based grocery store. He investigated their executive training program and is now a store manager. As the saying goes, you never know!

Connecting with a group that has a common interest eases the tension and stress that arises when meeting folks in a new setting. There is automatically a common thread of conversation that will allow you to talk and create new friends. These chats can open a path that you might not know about – or might not have considered.
