Legislative Report

The new year has arrived and there are many legislative issues that are on the table both at the State and Federal level. As you know, MOAA has been at the forefront over the years advocating for the enactment of legislation that helps our military, veterans, retirees and their families. The Alamo Chapter, one of the largest MOAA Chapters in the nation covers over half of the state of Texas in terms of having nine of the thirty-eight US Representatives, scores of Texas state representatives and many state senators.

As your vice president for legislative affairs for the Alamo MOAA Chapter, I am wanting to form a committee of Chapter members who can represent the Alamo MOAA Chapter within the offices of your local US Rep, Texas Rep and Texas Senator. In doing so, I will be asking that you spend a minimal amount of time visiting with these elected officials to promote legislation that we are interested in at the state and federal levels, as appropriate. This would entail meeting with the office staff of elected officials to promote legislation that we are interested in getting passed. You would also serve as the “go to” person for questions relative to military benefits and what would be beneficial legislation. STATE LEGISLATIVE REPORT

The state legislature has begun their session, elected a speaker of the house and at present over 1500 bills have been pre-filed. The leadership is looking at ways that they can further reduce property taxes, enhance the grid, fund schools and determine how to spend a multi-billion dollar surplus. Within the bills already filed are some which will provide protection for the thousands of Texas Guardsmen and women who are deployed to the border under state active duty. Under state active duty, they have very poor coverage under workmen’s compensation. Should they be injured, they have none of the protections that federal active duty offers. We are also looking at the possibilities of enhancing property tax exemptions for partially disabled veterans among other things.

Not much will actually happen until late February or early March until committee assignments have been made and key committees formed, where hearings on bills can actually start taking place.

FEDERAL ISSUES

During the second session of the 117th Congress, MOAA and other military and veteran service organizations (MSO/VSO) took the lead to get many laws passed which benefit-

ed the military, veterans and their families. This is something that MOAA has been recognized for over the last seventeen years by The Hill publication in Washington. Key among these were the PACT act, passage of the NDAA and rallying advocacy by the total membership during the height of the pandemic.

As a MOAA member, if you have not signed up with the quorum program for advocacy, you need to go to moaa.quorum.us and sign up for the program. In this way, your advocacy will be properly recognized as representing the Alamo Chapter, assist national MOAA in tracking who is advocating, and contribute to the Chapter’s annual Levels of Excellence awards. Bills related to the military benefits that were introduced in the 117th Congress will now have to be reintroduced with the 118th, and the new quorum program will make it very easy for you to advocate at the federal level.

When I retired in 2014, my passion was to help folks transitioning from the military to their new careers. This included the spouses who transition with each move. We've come a long way since then.

MOAA continues to build upon a very strong platform through its website www.moaa.org to provide members and non-members with a portfolio of resources. There are marvelous virtual career fairs and workshops. I highly recommend the member-only publications, the **Transition Guide**, **Marketing Yourself for a Second Career**, and **Guard/Reserve Retirement Guide**. MOAA also provides resume critiques and reviews for both civilian and federal resumes.

The Alamo Chapter expands upon these, providing local resources for those transitioning. Col David Patrick, the MOAA Career Transition Coordinator-Texas, sends a weekly email of resources and events to a wide email list. If you would like to add your email to the list, send it to me at kamconsulthr@gmail.com.

Both David and I meet with folks interested in one-on-one discussions on their individual transition plan. We are not into resume writing, that's your job. However, we consult with you on developing your transition strategies. Through the network with the JBSA Transition Alliance, we can assist in connecting you with ideas and possible connections. The Alamo Chapter transition team is also active in the community, assisting in the production of job fairs and other events that benefits those transitioning.

Transitioning is your responsibility. We can assist, guide, recommend, ... However, the task is yours. You must not feel alone in the process. We are here to help.

We are also looking to beef up the transition team. If you are interested, please connect with me for more details.
