### **Transition Tips**

One of the most common military career fields that folks mention when asked what civilian career interests them is human resources. The challenge or opportunity, whichever your viewpoint, is that there is a world of difference between the two.

I once chatted with a senior enlisted army-type who was interested in an HR position. I asked him to bring his resume and the job description with him when we met. The position was a senior HR manager for Boeing. Now Boeing is a great employer. There was a catch. We reviewed the resume and compared his Army experiences with the job description. The conversation went generally ok on the items listed on the primary responsibilities. However, once the conversation hit the skills required, the hiccups began. When asked about FMLA, OCA, EEOC, TCHR, ESOP, 401K, FSA, and benefits management to name a few, there was a blank stare.

I then asked about managing contracts. He replied that he had managed contracts. I clarified with a "no, labor contracts." Once he understood that I was referring to unions, replied that he had none. I explained that with 25 years as a HR director, I was not qualified for that position. My experience was always in non-union environments where I worked daily to keep it that way. We then started a search for a non-union opportunity.

The point is that there is a world of difference between the military and civilian HR environments. Not to say that you can't make it. However, you do need to do your research. Check out the opportunities to complete the HR certification. Onward to Opportunity is an excellent source. SkillBridge provides you with the opportunity to see the HR operation in action. Points to remember are that HR varies by industry, even company by company. Again, research will help you understand.

## Speaker Bio - LT. Gen. John Evans



Lt. Gen. John R. Evans, Jr. is the Commanding General of U.S.Army North (Fifth Army), headquartered at Fort Sam Houston, Texas.

U.S. Army North is the Theater Army and Army Service Component Command to U.S. Northern Command, the geographic combatant command for North America. U.S. Army North's mission is Homeland Defense, Defense Support of Civil Authorities and Theater Security Cooperation.

Prior to assuming command of U.S. Army North, he served as Commanding General, United States Army Cadet Command, Fort Knox, Kentucky.

After completing flight school, he was assigned as an Attack Platoon Leader in C /1-82nd Aviation Battalion, 82nd Airborne Division, Fort Bragg, North Carolina where he served in Operation Desert Shield/Desert Storm. Upon departing Fort Bragg in 1995, he served his first of three tours with the 160th Special Operations Aviation Regiment (Airborne) which included duties as A Company Commander; Regiment S3; Regiment Operational Assessment Element Commander Regiment Deputy Commander; Battalion Commander, 2nd Battalion; and Regiment Commander, Fort Campbell, Kentucky.

Other assignments include: Deputy Commanding Officer of the Combined Forces Special Operations Component Command – Afghanistan, Kabul Afghanistan; Chief of Staff of the Army Senior Fellow at The Brookings Institution, Washington, DC; Deputy Commanding General –Support for 2nd Infantry Division / Republic of Korea - US Combined Division in the Republic of Korea; and Commanding General, U.S. Army Special Operations Aviation Command (A), Fort Bragg, North Carolina. He has served multiple combat tours in Iraq and Afghanistan.

Lt. Gen. Evans was commissioned in 1988 as a Distinguished Military Graduate from Appalachian State University and is a graduate of the Armor Advanced Course, the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College and the U.S. Naval War College. He holds a Master of Arts in Adult Education from Kansas State University, and a Master of Arts in National Security and Strategic Studies from the U.S. Naval War College.

His military awards and decorations include the Distinguished Service Medal, Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit with two oak leaf clusters, BronzeStar with three oak leaf clusters, the Air Medal with V device and numeral 2.

Lt. Gen. Evans is married to the former Carolyn Ruppel of Nashville, Tennessee and they have two daughters.
