This food pantry event is a drive-through and will follow all local and CDC guidelines to provide the safest possible environment for veterans and volunteers. Veterans do not need to get out of the car. Masks are required at all times by everyone on site.

Care Packages

Soldiers' Angels are in urgent need of care package items in order to keep up with the increase in requests for support. They are also in need of financial donations to help cover the cost of shipping care packages and other items.

A donation of \$25 will ship a care package to a deployed service member. Below is a sample list of needed items for care packages or you can also shop their Amazon Wish List and have items sent directly to our warehouse.

Hygiene Items: Deodorant; Toothpaste, Toothbrush, Shampoo/Conditioner, Body Wash, Wet Wipes, Female Hygiene Products, Hand Warmers, Manicure Set, Back Scratchers, Socks (no tube socks), Hand Sanitizer, Cleaning Cloths/Spray (for glasses/goggles)

Snack Items: Protein Bars, Jerky or Meat Sticks, Sunflower Seeds, Freeze-Dried Fruit (Single Serve), Single-Serve Peanut Butter or Nutella, Single-Serve Cereals (Boxes or Cups, no bags as they will crush easily), Pop-Tarts, Nuts/Trail Mix (Single Serve Preferred), Tuna Salad Kit w/ Crackers, Chicken Salad Kit w/ Crackers, Powdered Drink Mixes like Crystal Light or Sports Drinks (Single Serve), Gum, Candy.

Down-Time Items: Small Balls or Footballs, Puzzle Books, Travel-Sized Games, Coloring Books, Pens/Pencils, Colored Pencils, Pencil Sharpeners.

Please AVOID the following items as they will not be able to include them: No aerosols or sprays in cans, No Pork or Pork By-Products (Slim Jims are OK), Tobacco or Alcoholic Beverage Products, Bars of Soap, Anything packaged in glass, Sharp Objects (Knives, Tools, Safety Pins, etc.), Pornography or other culturally sensitive material, Bagged Potato Chips (they are too easily crushed), Unwrapped Candies, Nail Polish, Perfume or Cologne.

If you're collecting items to provide support for troops or purchasing items locally, you can ship all of your items to their headquarters here in San Antonio. You will be responsible for all shipping costs.

Transition Tips

Navigating a New Economy

Chris Tomlinson, a staff columnist, wrote in the Sunday, June 19 edition of the San Antonio Express-News that “the global economy is undergoing fundamental changes that impact all of us.” We may have lived through the pandemic but it’s still being felt. The words inflation and recession, supply chain and staffing shortages, all have become common in our daily verbiage.

So, this month’s take on transition is about words. A recent zoom meeting attendee asked the question about the differences between “hybrid”, “in-person”, “remote” and “work from home”. These are just a few of the terms that are now in our lexicon in the workplace. Let’s start with what we know.

Working in-person has been the stalwart forever. We all show up at the appointed time and accomplish the various tasks within the confines of the workplace. We have the company’s latest equipment, ready resources and co-workers to tap when needed to accomplish the business and mission. Some businesses will require in-person, especially those with direct face-to-face interaction with the customer. We all want to see the clerk in a retail store or a housekeeper in a hotel.

The downside post-pandemic to in-person is that many employees are now proficient in zooming and working on-line. They enjoy the luxury of not dealing with commuting. There are fewer distractions like those created by workplace dramas. They feel they are more productive working from home, even when balancing things at home. How many of you washed the laundry or watched the kids while working from home? Other savings include reduced parking expenses, clothing allowances, and lunch savings.

Then there is the full-time work-from-home (sometimes called remote but we will chat about this later) employment. All of the previous points regarding working

Legislative Update

Federal

MOAA and others in the Military Coalition asked its members to send their senators a note via the Action Center to support the PACT Act. It evidently worked because the act was passed and signed into law last week. The law is HR 3967 and will provide the following:

- Access to care for 3.5 million veterans exposed to burn pits.
- Add 23 respiratory illnesses/cancers to the list of ailments presumed to be connected to toxic exposure.
- Expand Agent Orange presumptive exposure to include those with service in Thailand, Laos, and Cambodia during certain periods.
- Invest in VA research, facilities, staffing, and claims support surrounding toxic exposure.

We also need to send letters via the Action Center in support of the Major Richard Star Act and the Tricare Co-Pay relief acts.

Texas

Where the state is concerned, the Governor has asked that committees be formed to study what needs to be done following the Uvalde massacre.

This is the same thing he did with Sulphur Springs, and it resulted in zero legislative action, and it appears to be the same tactic and will likely result in nothing being done.

Many legislators both Republican and Democratic are demanding that he call a special session, however he is resisting.

from home now become positives. It does require the employer to ensure that the technology matches the needs of the employee and the business. Policies are created to ensure any security and other logistic concerns for the business. These policies also include critical procedures for payroll accounting, etc. For the business though, facility costs are reduced with the smaller physical workspace requirements. Many companies are also finding that there is a wider base of talent as there is not a geographic limitation. Tapping into a wider pool of applicants has greater opportunity for talent needed for this ever changing world.

The biggest challenges identified are more on the social aspects of employment. Employers need to ensure that there are opportunities for inclusion for those working remotely and make sure that the successes of the employee are recognized and rewarded. The remote employee's leadership and the employee must be diligent about staying connected so "out-of-sight" doesn't become "out-of-mind."

Finally, the hybrid. This is the combination that attempts to meet the needs of all. There is a balance of remote and in-person as determined by the needs of the business. The balances of the positive and the negative are overcome.

As a note, there is another term, remote, that needs clarification. This can also be used to describe the work away from the workplace but also can mean "on-the-road". This is a point to be clarified during the hiring process as one would with the many other employment points.

As you job search during your transition, you need to clarify your needs. Determine what work environment works best for you. Search out companies that fit this profile. Understand their expectations to ensure a match. Clarify their policies, etc. to ensure that the work conditions are supportive to productivity. While these are necessary for any job search, it's becoming more important in this fluctuating economy. An essential key is research and conversations as you pursue a company. Then you will have the information needed to make a career decision.

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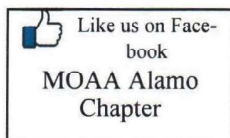
