# **Transition Tips**

# Countering the Stress of Interviewing

Interviewing can be one of the most stressful times in the job search process. There are unknowns that create anxiety. Who will interview? What questions will I be asked? How do I handle questions that I don't have answers for? Here are some pointers for interview prep.

You know from experience the value of prepping. It's the same here. The steps vary from your past experiences however the philosophies are the same. It's all about research – you and the company.

Let's talk about you first. The "civilian" workplace's differences are as varied as can be. Large corporations have a different culture and norms from small ones. Manufacturing is different from hospitality. Even in government, cultures vary from local to state to federal. It's important that you know what culture fits your needs. Cultures and environments vary in their degree of risk-taking versus conservatism. Some work allows flexibility in schedules, even work locations. Some are very structured while others are very unstructured. You need to determine what works best for you.

The next major step is to research the prospective employer. Do as much as you can to find out about the company. Find out who will conduct the interviews and the interview structure. Google the potential interviewers. Find out if there is a common factor. I interviewed with one company and found that I had worked in the same hotel as one of the interviewers. She was on LinkedIn. We discussed this during the icebreaker. This helped start the conversation and make it easier on us both. Note that the interviewer can be uncomfortable depending upon their level of interviewing experience.

Here are the points that the interviewer is trying to cover:

- Does the candidate have the skills that I require? Do these skills compliment the skills of the work team?
- How will the candidate fit into the company culture? And how will they fit into the work team?
- What is the understanding of the candidate with regards to the company, its mission and values? How will they fit?
- Does the candidate have the right mind set? What is the attitude and aptitude? Skills can be taught if they don't match exactly while attitude cannot. I learned this from my time at Marriott Hotels. The message from Bill Marriott Sr was that you can "teach skills but not attitude".
- Finally, how much does the candidate want the job?

As you can see, prepping sets you up for a knowledgeable discussion versus going in blind. We'll talk more about next steps in the interview process. Good luck in your job search.

# MOAA Alamo Chapter Leads Advocacy in Austin and Washington, D.C.

This spring, MOAA's Alamo Chapter took part in two pivotal advocacy events: the Texas Council of Chapters (TCC) "Advocacy in Austin" and MOAA National's "Advocacy in Action" on Capitol Hill.

In Austin, on March 30–31, 2025, Alamo Chapter President Kitty Meyers, along with Jim Cunningham, Jessica Dunn, Alana Pompa, Johanna Wynne, fellow Texas chapter leaders, and veterans from Texas State, engaged with legislators and staffers to champion key issues for Texas veterans and military families. Priority topics included addressing mental health workforce shortages, expanding affordable housing access, protecting DoD installation viability, and enhancing military spouse employment opportunities. The team urged law-makers to prioritize legislation and funding that directly impact the well-being of Texas service members, veterans, and their families.









A few weeks later, on April 9, MOAA Alamo Chapter members traveled to Washington, D.C., for MOAA's national "Advocacy in Action" campaign. Joining 150 MOAA leaders from across the country, they met with members of Congress to advocate for critical federal initiatives, including the Military Spouse Hiring Act. Kitty Meyers, BG Jim Dienst, and LTC Paul Hendricks,

representing the DoD advocacy team, met with staffers from Senator Ted Cruz's office to discuss top legislative priorities. BG Jim Dienst is both an Alamo Chapter member and a MOAA National Board Member.

Kitty also engaged in a valuable impromptu discussion with Congressman Morgan Luttrell (TX-8), a member of the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs, to discuss key veterans' issues. Meanwhile, Alamo Chapter Board Member Kim Biever joined her VA-focused team in advocating for improvements to unaccompanied housing, speeding up PACT Act benefits, and strengthening caregiver support programs.

# Legislative Affairs

The Texas Legislature is in full swing. The governor is happy because he got his school vouchers bill passed despite heated opposition from Democrats, rural Republicans and ISDs across the state. President Trump's sending active duty troops to the border seems to have given some relief to the state as it appears that many state troopers are no longer there.

The Texas Council of Chapters had a very successful Advocacy in Austin on 31 March. Alamo MOAA had a number of people there as well as many veterans from Texas State University led by Asst. Professor (Colonel) Jessica Dunn USA (Ret) to meet with all of our area Representatives and Senators. We went in armed with three priorities.

**Priority # 1:** Improve Veteran/family wellness by increasing access to care in areas with mental health workforce shortages.

**Priority # 2:** Support efforts to improve the quality of life of vulnerable Veterans and surviving spouses who reside in Texas.

**Priority # 3:** Maintain the viability of Department of Defense installations and ranges.

We had many comments from the reps that they appreciated that we had included listings of the bills both on the House and Senate sides that supported these three objectives. We can supply you with the body and content of each of these priorities, on request. Lt. Col Ginger Simonson was instrumental in putting these priorities together for which we thank her!

You will be getting periodic notifications as we have bills come before that legislature that we would like to see you support.

The Texas Council had a delegation go to the Advocacy in Action In Washinton the first of April. MOAA National was promoting five issues. President Kitty Meyers represented Alamo MOAA and saw many of our Texas representatives or their military/legislative staffers.

# Leadership Development Grants provided by the Alamo Chapter

Saturday, April 5, 2025 began on a cold and rainy morning as Air Force ROTC (AFROTC) Detachment 842 from the University of Texas at San Antonio (UTSA) hosted five AFROTC programs from across Texas for a leadership development event.

The Basic Expeditionary Airman Survival Training (BEAST) event took place at the Joint Base San Antonio-Lackland Chapman Annex Combat Skills Training Area and included cadets from UTSA, Texas Christian University, the



University of Houston, Texas State University and the University of Texas at Austin. Event planners dispersed the 97 trainees into teams composed of cadets from all five detachments, forcing them to exercise leadership and teamwork skills with cadets they had previously not known. Scenarios included air base defense, tactical combat casualty care (TCCC), and a

confidence course. All events were evaluated by cadets from the Professional Officer Corps, members of upper-class cadets (juniors and seniors) in the AFROTC programs.

BEAST was designed by the UTSA cadets with the assistance of professional trainers from the 319<sup>h</sup> Training Squadron assigned to JBSA-Lackland. These trainers provided hands-on exercises that added a "real-life sense of urgency" for the cadets.



During TCCC for example, the trainers included a mannequin that squirted "blood" during a traumatic injury. Cadets were required to solve the medical challenge and communicate with each other and with the "patient."



The MOAA-Alamo Chapter sends a special shout-out to UTSA AFROTC cadets Branson, Polexi, and Atkinson, the planners and leads for the event, for creating challenging leadership development for cadets who are expected to attend AFROTC Field Training in the summer of 2025. Cadre member Maj Tina Cavazos, UTSA Assistant Professor of Aerospace Studies, coordinated

this event for the third consecutive year, improving the scope and quality of training every year. The Alamo chapter was honored to provide financial assistance for the event, including travel, food and supplies--as we support leadership development of our future officers.

Lt Col (USAF, ret) Kitty Meyers, Alamo Chapter President, thanked cadets for their commitment in ROTC and reminded them of the MOAA motto, to Never Stop Serving!
