Speaker Bio



Daniel Menelly

A former science teacher for 20 years in public, independent and international schools in the U.S. and in France, Dan Menelly is presently Chief Executive Officer of The DoSeum.

Formerly, Mr. Menelly led the strategic direction of program and exhibition content as President & Chief Science Officer at The Rochester Museum & Science Center, The Strasenburgh Planetarium and the 900-acre Cumming Nature Center and preserve in Western New York from 2015 to 2018.

Between 2012 and 2015, Mr. Menelly served as Vice President for STEM education at Liberty Science Center in Jersey City, New Jersey, where he oversaw education program content for all audiences onsite, offsite and online. At Liberty, Mr. Menelly co-created hybrid formal/informal learning models in partnership with school systems and researchers, and he integrated emerging tools for learning (engineering and programming of microcontrollers, mobile learning with geospatial informatics, humanoid and social robotics) into the Science Center's education portfolio.

Mr. Menelly served as an Einstein Fellow at the National Science Foundation in 2010, where he specialized in technology and learning and coproduced an early STEM mobile application for learning that was downloaded by over one million end-users in over 100 countries and co-developed an early experiment in blended learning deployed in 20 international settings.

Mr. Menelly is currently an expert adviser for science and learning to the European Commission Research Executive Agency, and has advised STEM media content produced for PBS, Nickelodeon Television, The Sundance Channel and several other outlets.

Any connections or networking you've done is all for naught since these connections may not be of any use to your new home.

STOP! You never know when a connection may lead to new ones. Local professional organizations are usually an affiliate of a parent organization. The San Antonio Human Resources Management Association (SAHRMA) is an affiliate of the Society for Human Resources (SHRM). The same goes with project management, accountants, engineers and so many other professions. Get involved with the local affiliate and develop those connections.

How many of you have taken your kid on a school scouting trip to check out which one might be a good fit for university or college? I bet quite a few. The same philosophy goes with job hunting. Dear Alamo Chapter Members:

Can you believe it is almost income tax time again with the IRS lurking just around the corner?

Like any other volunteer based nonprofit organization it takes resources – people and operating capital -- to accomplish our mission and provide our 1200+ members the programs and services they deserve. We operate on a very lean annual operating budget of approximately \$35,000 and have the reputation for being fiscally responsible under tight cost controls. Membership dues cover less than 30% of our expenses so we must rely on non-dues revenue, i.e., advertising, corporate sponsorships and **individual donations** to help us keep our lights on and the doors open each year!

Additionally, the amount we award in Scholarships in any given year is based on the amount received through our fundraising efforts the previous year. In 2021 we were able to give 23 x \$1,000 to local JROTC and ROTC Cadets. but due to the pandemic our normal fundraisers had to be curtailed and we will be severely underfunded for the 2022 scholarship program.

So . . . I am asking you to please consider making a donation either to our Chapter Operations or to our Scholarship Fund.
