This influx of support along with the frugal management of expenses provides a solid foundation for our activities.

The Chapter staff continues to maintain solid connections with local, state and federal resources to support our outreach mission. Jim Cunningham represented us at the MOAA Annual Meeting in October, receiving the "5 Star" award. We are active in the Texas Council of Chapters and have representation at the Texas Council of Veteran Organizations, the Texas Veterans Commission Veteran Services Advisory Committee, two San Antonio

Chamber of Commerce committees, the JBSA Transition Alliance as well as other community activities. We continue to support other organizations such as Soldiers' Angels through various activities.

The Scholarship Committee excelled for this year's recognition of the ROTC and JROTC cadets. We awarded 29 one-thousand-dollar scholarships in March. Medals were mailed to 130 JROTC units. The successful 2021 golf tournament and the generous support throughout the year from our members and sponsors made this possible. We held the 2022 tournament on October 28, 2022. The scholarship committee is now working on processes leading to the March 2023 award event.

We continue to press forward. We thank you for your support and look forward to an exciting 2023.


Adopt-a-Family Holiday Support

Soldiers' Angels understands the many challenges faced by military and veteran families and providing a holiday celebration for their children should never be one of them.

The Soldiers' Angels Holiday Adopt-A-Family program helps businesses, organizations, and individuals support qualified military and veteran families that could use some help providing a holiday celebration for their families. Eligible families will receive (at minimum) gifts for each child and a grocery gift card to put towards a holiday meal.

Military and veteran families register with Soldiers' Angels and provide the necessary documentation to validate their service as well as their financial status. Though priority is given to families based on their income, Adopt-a-Family is designed to support all families.

After registration, qualified families are uploaded to our database and await adoption by individuals, organizations, and businesses. Once linked with their family, adoptors can view the family's wish list on our database and also contact the family with any questions or to arrange shipping/delivery of the gifts.





Speaker Bio

Jelynne LeBlanc Jamison



Jelynne LeBlanc Jamison is the President and Chief Executive Officer of The Center for Health Care Services (CHCS), the mental health authority for Bexar County.

Opened in 1966, CHCS has an operating budget of \$121 million and over 1000 skilled and compassionate team members who help people find the solutions they need to live healthy and productive lives. CHCS works with children and families at 35 locations around Bexar County, providing them with the resources and support they need to make their life better. CHCS' mission is to share hope and support recovery with a full spectrum of innovative services that promote healing and help people live life to their full potential.

Jamison brings over 37 years of leadership experience with complex governmental organizations. She previously served as the Executive Vice President and Chief Delivery Officer for CPS Energy, the largest municipally owned electric and gas provider in the nation, where she led a team of 1,853 employees and managed an operational budget of \$500 million. She led the organization with a customer-focused approach to service delivery and brought about technological, operational, and cultural enhancements. During her tenure with CPS Energy, Jamison served as the Acting General Manager during the NRG settlement negotiations and helped to rebuild public trust and stakeholder relationships, re-established a stable outlook with the bond rating agencies, and secured unanimous City Council approval for a new rate structure.

Prior to that, Jamison served as Deputy City Manager for Planning and Development with the City of San Antonio, with oversight for departments of Economic Development, Development Services, International Relations, Comprehensive Planning, Housing and Community Development, Public Works, Parks & Recreation, Code Compliance and the City Council Action Team. During her 24 years with the city, Jamison helped develop many economic and cultural development projects across the city, such as the development of the Alamodome, the 2001 expansion of the Henry B. Gonzalez Convention Center and the renovation of the Carver Community Cultural Center. Key economic development projects include Toyota Motor Manufacturing Plant, Rackspace Corporate Relocation, Texas A&M University, San Antonio Campus and over half a billion in capital improvement projects across the City of San Antonio.

In addition to her public executive level leadership, Jamison is currently an Independent Director for NuStar Energy – a leader in the petroleum pipeline and terminal industry with terminal and storage facilities in the U.S., Canada, and Mexico.

Jamison is also actively involved with a wide range of professional and nonprofit organizations, including serving as Chairwoman for the San Antonio Water System, Trinity

Transition Tips

It's Your Interview Too!

If you ever want an opportunity to check out resources for your job search, I would definitely recommend www.shrm.org. This is the website for the Society of Human Resource Management. Most of the site is available for non-members and holds such a wealth of information.

I happened upon an article submitted by Martin Yate, a best-selling author and career coach. This article talked about actions to be taken if the interviewer controls the interview, i.e., "does all of the talking". I hate to besmirch my fellow HR folks as well as many managers, but some just don't know how to interview. They dominate the conversation. They don't dig into who you are and find out your capabilities to do the job.

Mr. Yates gives some great tips on how to take control of the interview from your end.

- The interviewer will chatter on about the company and the needs. Ensure you highlight those in order to communicate your understanding of them.
- Come prepared to provide examples of accomplishments. Keep them related to the job description and what they are looking for.
- Research the company and identify potential problems. Have possible solutions and interject as appropriate during the conversation.

Now, some interviewers may not provide you with any in-depth information about their company and the workspace. Make sure that you have job related questions. You will have the opportunity to ask about benefits, etc. at another point in the interview process.

No interview will ever go as you anticipated. You need to be flexible. This is your opportunity to really show them what you've got. Best of luck.

It's Almost Tax Time Again!

Will you give more to the IRS or make a tax deductible donation to MOAA-AC?

Dear Alamo Chapter Members:

Can you believe it is almost income tax time again with the IRS lurking just around the corner?

Like any other volunteer based nonprofit organization it takes resources – people and operating capital -- to accomplish our mission and provide our 900+ members the programs and services they deserve. We operate on a very lean annual operating budget of approximately \$35,000 and have the reputation for being fiscally responsible under tight cost controls. Membership dues cover less than 30% of our expenses so we must rely on non-dues revenue, i.e., advertising, corporate sponsorships and **individual donations** to help us keep our lights on and the doors open each year!

Additionally, the amount we award in Scholarships in any given year is based on the amount received through our fundraising efforts the previous year. In 2022 we were able to give 29 x \$1,000 to local JROTC and ROTC Cadets and now we are looking to bolster the 2023 scholarship program.
