## JBSA Phone App

Joint Base San Antonio recently launched a new smartphone app designed to provide quick access to installation information and resources.

Dubbed "JBSA Connect," the free app is now available for download from the Apple App Store and Google Play Store. It consolidates basic details about JBSA's three primary locations: JBSA-Fort Sam Houston, JBSA-Lackland, and JBSA-Randolph.

The free app's features include gate and construction updates and base status alerts. Users can also submit feedback and requests within the app.

The native mobile app also features operating hours, phone numbers and local amenities for services and facilities across JBSA. Interactive maps and directions provide navigation assistance around the expansive joint base.

It is the latest effort to modernize information-sharing and services at JBSA, one of the largest joint bases in the U.S. military.

# Legislative Report

In case you haven't noticed, National MOAA has a newly designed website. I would encourage you to log on to the new website and explore its changes. When you first attempt to logon, it will require that you change your password and then logon. It will ask that you update your information and then will allow you to go to the home page. Of course, I want you to go to the Advocacy section and submit your letters of support to the various issues that have been identified that we need legislative support for from our representatives and senators. You will then be asked to update your information for the letters and be sure to indicate that you are part of the Alamo Chapter TX-16. Issues range from military child care, VA legislation, military spouse issues and so forth.

On the state legislative preparation, we are still waiting on the runoff elections to be held for various representatives. The Governor, Lt. Governor and Attorney General have mounted challenges to lawmakers who voted against school vouchers and who supported the impeachment of the AG. Chief among these is Speaker Phelan. IThe Lt. Governor issued interim charges to the senate committees, instructing them to begin holding hearings on these matters. Speaker Phelan has also issued interim charges for the House Committee Chairs to start examining.

On the senate side, the Veterans Affairs committee received the following:

- Veteran Mental Health: Review current programs that provide direct and indirect mental health services to veterans in Texas. Identify barriers to accessing mental health resources for rural veterans. Make recommendations to improve access to mental health support for all veterans.
- Support Service Database for Texas Veterans: Review and report on the progress toward the creation of a single database to facilitate the seamless provision of veteran benefits by state agencies. Make recommendations to improve coordination among state, federal, and local agencies and others that provide benefits to veterans.
- Strengthen Support for Veteran Housing: Study the
  accessibility and affordability of veteran housing. Identify factors that contribute to veteran homelessness.
  Determine whether the Veterans Land Board has the
  tools necessary to maximize their assistance to eligible
  borrowers in home lending. Make recommendations to
  update state standards related to veteran home loans
  and housing.

The committee held its first hearing on May 15 with invited testimony. Ginger Simonson from the Texas Council of Chapters attended as did Jim Brennan from

the Texas Coalition of Veterans Organizations (TCVO). Jim Brennan reported that there was little substance, at this time, that would be of any concern and there was no questioning by the senators on the committee. No additional committee hearings have been scheduled at this time.

Where the House is concerned, the following charges were given by the Speaker to the Defense and Veterans Affairs Committee:

- 1. **Monitoring:** Monitor the agencies and programs under the Committee's jurisdiction and oversee the implementation of relevant legislation passed by the 88th Legislature. Conduct active oversight of all associated rulemaking and other governmental actions taken to ensure the intended legislative outcome of all legislation, including the following:
  - HB 90, relating to benefits for certain members of the Texas military forces and survivors of members of the Texas military forces; and
  - HB 671, relating to a veteran's suicide prevention campaign.
- 2. **Identification and Support of Texas Veterans**: Identify barriers to identifying and verification of veteran status. Make recommendations to improve identification efforts to better engage and support the state's veteran populations.
- 3. **Professional License Portability for Military and Spouses**: Evaluate compliance statewide with the Section 19 of the Veterans Auto and Education Improvement Act of 2022 (P.L. 117-333, 50 U.S.C. §4025a), concerning the portability of professional licenses of service members and spouses and make recommendations to ensure that service members and their spouses may, under appropriate circumstances, continue to practice under a license issued by another jurisdiction.
- 4. **Strength of Texas Military Bases**: Review the federal criteria for considering and recommending base closure or realignment and evaluate the strength of Texas Military Bases under the scoring system utilized by the U.S. Department of Defense. Make recommendations to mitigate the risk of realignments or closures of military installations in Texas.

No hearings have been scheduled at this time to address these issues and will probably not be until the runoff elections are completed.



- Ability to motivate and interact with a diverse range of individuals.
- Ability to plan and organize.
- Not hesitant to ask individuals to help/volunteer.
- Have a current driver's license and reliable transportation.

#### **Major Responsibilities:**

• Recruit volunteers to fill positions, as needed.

- Assist executive team members in matching volunteers to their administrative needs.
- Send emails to all those new/renewing members who indicated an interest in volunteering.
- Send email to members who indicate an interest in volunteering.
- Make timely contact with the members to allow them to express their interests and qualifications for any chapter needs.
- Collaborate with the executive team who have needs that could be met with the assistance of a volunteer.

## **Transition Tips**

## Using AI for Resume Writing

For those of you who know me, computer literacy is not one of my strengths. It doesn't take much for me to screw it up. I count my blessings for the Geek Squad. They have bailed me out of more jams than I can count. So, here I am writing this article about AI – artificial intelligence. I found a saving grace.

A week or so ago, I watched the MOAA webinar entitled "How Generative AI Can Help You Land Your Job." Francis Q. "France" Hoang, the cofounder of Boodle AI and a graduate of the US Military Academy, facilitated the most fantastic webinar that I have attended in a long time. I'm not going to go into great detail because I want you to check it out on <a href="https://www.moaa.org">www.moaa.org</a>. You can find it with other transition resources. However, here are highlights.

- AI is the next step to creating a resume HOWEVER it is only useful for about 80% of the content. You need to personalize and tailor for the best results.
- You can also use it to create your LinkedIn (LI) profile.
- You need to develop a list of questions to ask AI so that it knows what information to build into the resume or LI profile. You're basically giving it instructions about what to include.
- AI is very good at removing military jargon (remember to give it that instruction).
- You can ask AI for a list of potential careers. (This is not like one of those surveys that tells you to be an artist.)
- Talk to AI like you are talking to a colleague. Provide personal likes and dislikes, etc., so that it gets to know you.
- AI can help generate cover letters too.

From this webinar, you will find that there is a long list of all of the stuff that AI can help you with for the job search. AI is this force multiplier for your job search. As always, it's only as good as the information that you give it. However, this is the next step to using technology to improve your job search.
