Art V para A. Deleted "Redundant with C."

Art VII para A. Added the new VP titles/positions that were previously approved for by the Board.

Art VII para E. Added the new VP duties and responsibilities.

Art VII para F. Deleted Advertising Coordinator and Awards, and Scholarships Committee Chair since these are now the VP Marketing and Development and VP Scholarships and Leadership Development positions.

Arts VIII and XIII. Changed from "employee" to "staff" since we technically have no "employees" since Trish is an independent contractor.

Art XI para A. Cleaned up reference to the Foundation with its new acronym, i.e., "MACEF"

Page 11. Changed Board Chair signature block.

We operate on a very lean annual operating budget of approximately \$35,000 and have the reputation for being fiscally responsible under tight cost controls. Membership dues cover less than 30% of our expenses so we must rely on non-dues revenue, i.e., advertising, corporate sponsorships and **individual donations** to help us keep our lights on and the doors open each year!

Additionally, the amount we award in Scholarships in any given year is based on the amount received through our fundraising efforts the previous year. In 2023 we were able to give 31 x \$1,000 to local JROTC and ROTC Cadets plus \$3,000 towards ROTC Leadership Development activities and now we are looking to bolster the 2024 scholarship program.

Transition Tips

Continuing the "Service"

Many transitioning from active duty find that there is a void within. Something is missing that can't be identified. For how many years we served our country. We had a mission to fulfill. That became an identity, a purpose. All of a sudden, even if planned, it was lifted when we took off the uniform.

Some focus on family. Others focus on finding employment. All super! However, some don't feel that that is enough. I have an option for you. This can be either full-time or part-time or even occasionally. For as many hours as you want. It means giving to your new community while also filling that void.

In previous articles in both the president's column and in those written for this transition column, I've talked about volunteering. You're asking about why I now would include this in a column about transitioning. It's really quite simple.

I talk about finding your passion. One way to investigate is by volunteering with an organization such as a nonprofit that can utilize your skills while you get to know the community. You'll meet new friends and possibly employment contacts. In essence, you are building your network and establishing community connections.

You will also be exploring how your skills translate into civilian speak. You could also pick up skills that enhance your resume. This can be done all the while you are testing the marketplace for direction in your job search. AND, you will be helping your new community.

Without, hopefully, being too simplistic about it, volunteering gives an opportunity to meet new people and explore your community while having fun. You'll feel the value of giving. The reward is intrinsic and can also lead to the extrinsic – a new job! Best of luck and happy holidays.




