## President's Message

We at MOAA and the Alamo Chapter are non-partisan so that we can "work" both sides of the aisle on the issues that affect the military. However, as citizens of the USA, we have a responsibility to vote.

As a cocky college student, I got into a lively discussion. Was voting a right or a responsibility? I advocated for the "right to vote." I was reminded that while this is a right by the Constitution, it is the responsibility of every citizen. The chapter has just sent an eblast to all members regarding voter registration. While I'm writing this letter prior to the September lunch, a speaker will be addressing the issue. Don't wait until election day to discover that you are not registered to vote. I just heard that one person who thought he was registered was in fact not. He is now chasing down the form needed to reregister. The cutoff date is October 7. Check the Texas Secretary of State website to verify your status.

Another issue is also a concern. I received a flash notice from AAA Texas on "phishing." For those who have not experienced this, it's a fraudulent email that directs you to purchase gift cards or complete some other task to provide funds to the initiator of the email. PLEASE CHECK THE IN-COMING EMAIL ADDRESS. If it doesn't look correct, it's not.

One of our members received an email allegedly from me asking that they purchase Target gift cards and send them the card numbers, etc. Money that would have gone to the bad guys. I was called to verify the request. I immediately replied that it was bogus and asked for the email address. It wasn't mine. My next word was DELETE. Lesson learned.

Please be aware that there are folks out there who prey upon us. Their goal is to get money or confidential information from us and then exploit that information for their benefit – NOT OURS. Be vigilant and read thoroughly If it sounds fishy, it's phishing. Don't get caught.

I hope to see the golfers at our tournament on Friday, October 18 at the Ft Sam Golf Course. We still have space. Registration is available on our website.

### **Proposed Revisions to Alamo Chapter Bylaws 2024**

**Background:** At the May 22, 2024 Chapter Board meeting the Chair, Jarvis Baker, asked that the Bylaws be reviewed to ensure that they adequately address the term limits of Board members as well as the desired number of members on the Board. This proposed revision also administratively "cleans-up" some minor grammatical elements of the current Bylaws.

Eric Krietz, Board member and David Patrick, Acting Chapter Secretary, volunteered to draft the proposed revisions. The proposed revisions were approved by the Chapter Staff on August 8 at their monthly staff meeting and subsequently approved by the Board of Directors on August 15 for presentation to the membership for concurrence and approval at the Annual General Business Meeting on November 21. This paper summarizes the proposed revisions. A full copy of the redlined bylaws can be found on the chapter website or requested from the office.

<u>Sequence of the Articles:</u> The Articles were re-arranged to make the Bylaws better sequenced while positioning the Board of Directors Article III more prominently upfront.

#### <u>Article I – Organization:</u>

- Para C: Update the official name of the Chapter Foundation to the "Military Officers Association of America (MOAA) Alamo Chapter Educational Foundation (MACEF).
- <u>Para F, G & H:</u> Use the term "Chapter" as the name of the organization as noted in para A. Article I.

#### **Article II – Membership:**

- <u>Para B, sub-para 4: includes</u> "Friends of the Chapter" as a class of membership; changes line B. from three to four classes;
- Para E: changes name of organization to "Chapter" as addressed in para A, Article I;
- <u>Para H:</u> deletes "Friends of the Chapter" reference as it was moved to Para B. as an official class of membership.

#### **Article III – Board of Directors - Officers & Directors:**

- Para A, 2: changes Vice-Chairman to Vice-Chair;
- <u>Para B. 1</u>: adds reference that Friends of the Chapter are not eligible to serve on the Board as voting members or hold office;
- <u>Para E:</u> outlines the purpose of the board, the number of meetings annually and what constitutes a quorum;
- Para E, 1: establishes the number of Board members as 5;
- Para E, 9: addresses term limits of directors;
- Para E, 10: clarifies who may run for Board membership.

## **Transition Tips**

It's the time of the year for the biggest job fair for the San Antonio military community. Workforce Solutions Alamo, the local for the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC), is holding the Red, White and You (RWY) Hiring Fair on Thursday, November 6 at the Freeman Expo Hall (3201 Houston St).

For those outside of the San Antonio area, there will be coordinating fairs throughout Texas during the same period. Check out www.twc.texas.gov for the dates and locations near you. PLEASE NOTE THAT EACH OF THESE IS OPEN TO THOSE TRANSITIONING, VETERANS, RETIREES AND SPOUSES.

So now that you have a job fair to attend, you need to prepare. It can be intimidating as you'll see a large expo hall with lots of booths. Each booth will have an employer seeking to fill openings. It's up to you to navigate through the maze. You must be prepared to get the full value of the event. Here are some tips for this or any fair.

- 1) **Register Now!** Don't hesitate to register for these fairs. The RWY's registration is through the TWC website. Other fairs will provide you with the appropriate registration links. It eases the entry when hundreds are expected.
- 2) **Research the Companies.** You need to review the list of participating employers prior to the event. The job fair website will update the list of employers, and hopefully along with the open positions, as the event date gets closer. Identify those that interest you. Research the company and the positions. Prep questions to ask the recruiter when you are at the fair booth.
- 3) **Apply for interesting positions prior to the event.** This will be a great opening comment when talking to the recruiters.
- 4) Leverage Your LinkedIn Profile. As an HR, once I had identified a candidate of interest for a job

opening, my next step was to google and search the LinkedIn profile. I consider this the resume on steroids. Lots of information to gain better insight into the applicant.

- 5) **Update Your Resume.** I have chatted multiple times about the value of targeted resumes. I continue to recommend a master resume that can be tailored to each specific job description. While you might not be able to zero in on a specific job description for a job fair, you can create one that covers the overall focus of your job search. Remember that a solid resume includes impact statements and key skills that describe your accomplishments.
- 6) Have a Professional Biography Ready. A biography provides you with the means to "create a softer introduction" to a potential employer. This supplements the direct skills/accomplishments picture presented in a resume. It is extremely helpful if you are interested in the company but are unsure or open to any specific job.
- 7) **Select the Proper Attire.** There are videos, etc. posted on the MOAA website as well as other sources that help you understand how to best visually present yourself. A word to the wise presentation is everything. Also, remember that you will be on your feet constantly. Wear comfortable shoes. The fairs usually have opportunities for free "professional" photos. Your chance to get an update for your LinkedIn profile.
- 8) **Prep Your Elevator Pitch**. Make the most of the opportunity to introduce yourself with clarity in the first 30 seconds.
- 9) **Remember to Smile.** This is part of your attire. Your facial expressions, especially your smile, show your personality and your interest. Don't blow it with a grumpy face.


