





HELLO FELLOW MOAA MEMBERS!

It is with great pleasure that I have been granted to write some medical articles for the Lariat, our Newsletter! Realizing I better be careful, accurate, certainly know my limitations and roles here even with 50 years of RN experiences, I thought that since many of us in our MOAA Chapter are over 60, why not discuss the latest Health & Human Services (HHS) guidelines.

We can discuss HHS guidelines with our Primary Care Provider (PCP) on any visit, but especially for the annual visit. We need to learn which tests you need to monitor your health just like anyone else. Get a checklist to take with you to your next visit with your health care practitioner. LIVING WITH ZEST FOR LIFE IN YOUR 60S AND BEYOND

Ladies first, right? For your ANNUAL physicals, Ladies, you should receive a full checkup including height, weight and blood pressure, a discussion of sleep patterns, a Thyroid Test (TSH), and a cholesterol panel. A bone Density Screen should be done with a repeat every few years. We all need a blood glucose or A1C Test every three years but is usually added every year. The A1C represents your average Glucose for the last 2 to 3 months. Let's all try to remember these numbers: Regarding the A1C, less than 5.7% means you don't have diabetes.

- 5.7% to 6.4% signals pre-diabetes.
- 6.5% or higher usually indicates Type 2 diabetes (or Type 1 diabetes).

(2) Here you will find the latest guidelines to include what will change in 2026. Please remember that women need a Mammogram every 1-2 years, a clinical breast exam and Pelvic Exam yearly, and discuss a Pap test with your PCP. Annually women should discuss mental health screening. Cont on pg.11

Colorectal Health uses one of three methods: a fecal occult blood test yearly, flexible sigmoidoscopy every 5 years or colonoscopy every 10 years (I recommend the last one).

When it comes to our eyes and ears, please get an eye exam every 1-2 years and a hearing test every 3 years. Skin wise, self-examine any mole and as part of a full routine checkup. Medicare pays for an annual full skin exam by a Dermatologist. Take advantage of our benefits! Discuss with your dentist every 1 to 2 years on cleaning and full exam. Dental health is very important!

The medical community today believes in obtaining flu vaccines as indicated especially for babies younger than 2 and over 65. I usually get mine in late September. Please discuss the RSV, the Pneumococcal Vaccine, Covid vaccine, and flu shot with your PCP if needed but since I am over 75, I have received the RSV (recommended for immunocompromised), the Pneumococcal and Covid shots recently. I and all of the



physicians I have spoken to regarding Covid shots over the years, recommend them as well. The pneumococcal shot is given only once to prevent Pneumonia. Oops, I almost forgot the Shingles Vaccine! And I had shingles twice over several years and it isn't fun my friends!!! "SHINGRIX is recommended for the prevention of herpes zoster and related complications[‡] for immunocompetent adults ≥50 years old:

- SHINGRIX is recommended regardless of whether they report a prior dose of Zostavax, a shingles vaccine that is no longer available for use in the United States
- It is not necessary to screen, either verbally or by laboratory serology, for evidence of prior varicella infection." (3)

And yes, Covid research was conducted as quick as possible during the pandemic, but there were no short cuts in the research process. There are no guarantees for outliers but majority of physicians believe in them.

Tetanus shots are to be done every 10 years! Just think of all of the scratches we have had over the years. It's also critical to make sure you keep records of your immunizations over the years. I suggest you talk to your PCP and the locations of where you receive shots soon if you have not kept record.

Now, let me go over the Men's guidelines. We follow many of the women's guidelines such as lab work, bone density tests, diabetes, overweight and obesity, mental health, colon health, and vaccine coverages. But doctors follow us closely for Blood Pressures and Cholesterol and if you were or are still smoking and are between 65-75, he/she might recommend an Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (AAA). The test is an Ultrasound that examines the belly for an aneurysm which can be lifethreatening.

The Annual Prostate Exam for men over 60 is crucial to detect potential issues early. The frequency of these exams and screenings can vary based on individual risk factors and health history. Here are some guidelines: Cont page 11

- Men 50 and over should discuss prostate cancer screening with their doctor and consider a PSA test and Digital Rectal Exam (DRE) every 1-2 years.
- Men at higher risk should start screening at age 40-45.
- Men under 40 typically don't need routine prostate exams unless they have significant symptoms or risk factors.

Regular check-ups can significantly boost health outcomes and quality of life. These include prostate examinations beginning at 50, along with cholesterol screenings and diabetes tests.(4)

At any rate, family history is important to include heart issues and diabetes. Remember to discuss lifestyle, diet, exercise, and smoking. Younger men should self-exam their testes and report abnormalities. Lastly, a follow up should be done from tests and referrals. I also recommend people to get a referral to see a Registered Dietitian, especially if your insurance allows it, in the case of overweight, and if one has other medical conditions requiring it.

Transition Tips
