VP Membership: COL Felix Santiago, USA (Ret) – Membership chart shows 87 Active Duty, 143 Surviving Spouse, 29 Former, 674 Retired for a total membership of 933. This year has seen a 3% increase in membership and the number of dues paying members has also been increased demonstrating a stabilizing

trend in membership. MOAA's NRT report from last month will provide us with 16 automatic adds and 14 invitations that have been mailed. A few familiar names appeared on the Final Final Email renewal list, and renewal will be encouraged.

As restrictions are relaxing on post, the newcomer orientations will be held in person instead of virtually, allowing for increased recruitment opportunities.

VP Programs: Col David Patrick, USAF (Ret) – (absent). David provided the latest program calendar and survey results from the Scholarship awards luncheon. Speaker David Garza's presentation provided great messaging and valuable tools for the awardees. He also interacted very personably with each winner. Overall impression was an excellent event. April's event will be at the ARC, the MOAA national travel show will be on May 15 and for this a mass email will be sent by MOAA to all officers in our catchment area and we hope to be able to set up a recruiting table there too, alongside Viking & Celebrity cruise lines. It was decided to change the annual June dinner dance to a Happy Hour given the uncertain times and a possible virus resurgence. It was noted the August luncheon maybe be better at Ft Sam Golf course rather than RBFCU to accommodate the speaker and any active-duty folks who may wish to attend. September's could be at RBFCU.

VP Legislative Affairs: Maj Jim Cunningham, USA (Ret) – At the end of the last session interim charges were produced for the legislators to review before the next session, but the majority are not relevant to the military. These will be studied and priorities set in conjunction with the TCVO. There are many new members of congress who have never been in the military, and this will involve extensive educational efforts. MOAA national's Advocacy in Action to be held in April and the three main talking points (Star Act, Mental Health Care Co-Pays, and Pay Raise) will be submitted to members of congress for them to review during their hiatus.

VP Marketing and Development: Col Lisa Skopal, USAF (Ret) – (See Scorecard update).

President: Lt Col Kitty Meyers, USAF (Ret) – Currently working on Level of Excellence Award submission, and needs inputs from those contacted.

Had requested the ARC and Blue Skies set up collection boxes for Soldiers' Angels sock drive and managed to drop off 2 huge bags. Need to find similar outreach activities to increase the connectivity between chapter members.

Jim advised he and Kitty are continuing to meet with JBSA leadership regarding the office building lease. Insuring the total value of the building is a requirement and Jim is currently working with a couple of brokers to obtain quotes.
