The budgets have been revised to show a more realistic projection after the removal of the Golf Tournament and the social events due to the pandemic. Advertising looks to be able to achieve 50% of budget at best and knows Lisa is working hard at soliciting but common response is that they too have reduced revenues and also have not seen an advantage from members using their services. Corporate Partnerships are also down. Ed Marvin agreed to contact RBFCU regarding their renewal

Vaughn to produce an article for The Lariat how the chapter has been affected financially and requesting donations.

Estimated dues for the rest of the year were calculated at \$7,780 total if everyone renews. (Active Duty is \$2,740; Former \$240, Retired \$4,380, Surviving Spouse \$420). Felix to work on the retention rate so far for the retiree component to give us feel for what % of that we are likely to receive and adjust next year's budget accordingly.

Noted that the ACEF balance is down to \$14k which was the decided minimum threshold. The formation of the ACEF Board should be an asset here as they will also be assisting in fundraising.

**VP Membership:** COL Felix Santiago, USA (Ret) – Membership has increased by 25% since Jan 1 and 80% in the last month. The goal will remain at 1200. Much of the increase is due to the Near Real Time reports from MOAA national which provide the names and contact info of members who have either joined or relocated into our catchment area. The list is available for only the month prior but MOAA national was kind enough to provide the list since January – hence an increase of 400 members this month. We are providing free memberships and adding those folks automatically who have indicated they want to receive chapter emails (only one so far has declined due to age and location) and sending out letters and an application form to those who have not provided an email address. The MOAA Near Real Time reports will include the Austin area going forward. The chapter has lost over 100 members year to date. We are continuing to contact those deletions and have gained some back!

A slide and an application will be included in the bi-weekly Newcomer Briefing presentation beginning tomorrow.

Thomas Tucker will assist Felix in spreading the word of the chapter to the Active Duty folks. David asked about retention rates to better estimate accounts receivables for next year's budget. Felix will research it.

Current membership stands at 1458 consisting of 411 Active Duty, 177 Surviving Spouses, 52 Former Military and 818 Retired.

**VP Programs:** Col David Patrick, USAF (Ret) – Most recent webinar in August from SAWS drew 40+ attendees. September will be a virtual Happy Hour at 4pm with author and Texas historian Dr Paul Spellman. The Annual General Meeting typically held in November will also be virtual. December's meeting will hopefully be a speaker commemorating the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Randolph Brooks AFB. There may be an opportunity to sell their Fiesta medals with proceeds going to the chapter. (If successful, Haven For Hope speaker may be moved to January).

**VP Legislative Affairs:** Maj Jim Cunningham, USA (Ret) – Summer Storming event is complete but not much going on at state or federal. Currently no changes are in the works as regards NDAA. The results of the November election will determine the course of action come January. Provided handout on MOAA guidance regarding partisan political activities (see appendix A).

**President:** LtCol Kitty Meyers, USAF (Ret) – Thanked the chapter members and leadership team for the receipt of yet another Five Star Levels of Excellence Award for 2019 from MOAA national. Health Protection Condition (HPCON) is currently at C which means all meetings are obliged to be virtual. The new 502<sup>nd</sup> Wing Commander, Brigadier General Caroline Miller, has extended these protocols through the end of September.

Currently working on getting the ACEF Board up and running which should be approved and finalized at the next Board meeting scheduled for Thursday.

Last year the chapter Board requested budget approvals be submitted earlier than December so the next staff meeting (October) will be the annual planning session.

Continuing to work with the chamber and providing Transition Assistance where needed.

Hoping to meet up with the new Space Force Commander during their San Antonio visit.

# Appendix A

## MOAA GUIDANCE ON PARTISAN POLITICAL ACTIVITIES

**Partisan Political Activities.** As organizations exempt from federal taxation under Sec. 501(c)(19) of the Internal Revenue Code, MOAA and its affiliates must take care to avoid engaging in partisan political activities. Under IRS rules, we are prohibited from directly or indirectly participating in, or intervening in, any political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for public office.

**Candidates for Public Office.** A candidate for public office is an individual who offers himself or herself, or is proposed by others, as a contestant for an elective public office, whether such office is national, state, or local, and includes incumbent candidates. The prohibition also extends beyond declared candidates and may apply to efforts to recruit an individual to run for office or advance exploratory activities. The prohibition also applies to advocating for the platform of one political party over another.

### **Prohibited Activities.**

Activities which constitute participation or intervention in a political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to a candidate include, but are not limited to, the publication or distribution of written or printed statements or the making of oral statements on behalf of or in opposition to such a candidate. It is clear that the prohibition on partisan political activity prohibits such outright actions such as posting a “Vote for Biden” or “Vote for Trump” on the organization’s website, or “Support Republican Candidates” or “Vote Democratic.”

In addition to these obvious examples, the prohibition goes well beyond direct expressions of support. In determining whether an organization is engaged in unlawful partisan political activities, the IRS applies a “facts and circumstances” test. The IRS looks not only to the expressed language, but to external factors, such as the communication’s timing, its targeted audience, and how the message relates to public policy positions that distinguish a candidate in a campaign.

**Consequences for Violations.** The consequences to an organization that violates the prohibition on partisan political activity can be severe including the loss of its tax-exempt status and the imposition of certain excise taxes. For public charities, like The MOAA Foundation and the MOAA Scholarship Fund, the IRS can disallow tax deductions for charitable contributions. In addition, for an organization whose mission involves advocacy on key military community issues, MOAA must seek support from elected representatives from both parties. Engaging in partisan political activities on behalf of one party or candidate would seriously undermine MOAA’s ability to achieve the bipartisan consensus on key issues essential to achieving its legislative objectives.

**Personal Opinions.** As individuals, members and leaders of MOAA and MOAA’s affiliates are not prohibited from engaging in partisan political activities so long as they do so in way that makes it clear they are acting for themselves and do not appear to be speaking on behalf of MOAA or its affiliates. For example, it is permissible for an individual to express his or her personal preference in support of or in opposition to a candidate or political party. And they may do so publicly. However, when expressing their personal opinions or preferences, they may not make reference to their MOAA position, use MOAA communications channels, use MOAA letterhead or newsletters, identify themselves as MOAA leaders, or imply that MOAA or its members share their beliefs.

**Leadership Responsibilities.** Those in leadership positions have a special responsibility to separate their personal political opinions from statements that are or can be attributed to MOAA or its affiliates. For example, it is improper for a chapter leader to use the chapter’s newsletter to advance the leader’s personal political beliefs. This goes beyond statements expressly advocating for a specific candidate or party by name. Statements that incorporate campaign messaging, campaign slogans, and political positions identified with a particular candidate or party are also prohibited. No MOAA leader is

authorized to use MOAA's or an affiliate's resources to communicate their personal political beliefs. This is an outright violation of the leader's fiduciary duty to the organization and a serious leadership and ethical failure.

**Divisive Social Issues.** We are all aware of the divisive nature of the debate over today's leading social issues – protesting during the national anthem at sporting events, racial justice, public protests, and the conduct of law enforcement officers. These are issues over which many Americans have deeply held, but differing, personal beliefs. This is also true within the military community among the ranks of active duty and retired officers and within MOAA itself. MOAA leaders have an obligation to keep this in mind when communicating on behalf of MOAA or its affiliates. Suggesting that MOAA only supports one side of a deeply divisive issue sends a message to those with a different belief that MOAA is not for them. Officers today have grown up in a military culture that is very different than the past. Many are accepting of attitudes and views that were not mainstream when many of us were in uniform. If MOAA is going to connect with the newest generation of uniformed officers, it needs to be clear that those with strong views on racial and social justice imperatives are just as welcome as those who adhere to more traditional expressions of patriotism and officership.
