Kitty pointed out this year we are being very conservative on the expenses. Typically, the Goodie Bag has cost us \$25 but this year is only \$4.50 for the sleeve of golf balls. Golf Tournament is sold out. Do not have a title sponsor but Lisa has managed to get Blue Skies to be a platinum sponsor. As we are not at River Crossing, we do not have the River Crossing LGA to assist as in past years so will need more volunteers for this event, and email will be going out soon.

**VP Membership:** COL Felix Santiago, USA (Ret) — Current chart shows 222 Active Duty, 160 Surviving Spouse, 62 Former and 828 Retired giving a total of 1272, with a net loss of 34 (2.6%). The chart is a mixed bag, but 67% of dues paying members is an increase. Active Duty reduced by the annual PCS movement. Looking at the list of those receiving the "Final Final" email before being deleted, if any are known personally, please reach out and encourage them to renew stressing the benefits of supporting the chapter. Visibility and exposure will help with renewals and typically more events occur at this time of year, aided by the COVID restrictions are slowly reduced. Renewals over the next three months involve over 500 members, or 40% of membership. Of those 80% are directly from the catchment area and the soon to be distributed solicitation and renewal letters will reach those too.

**VP Programs:** Col David Patrick, USAF (Ret) – Absent. Kitty recapped that the September event had to be cancelled due to the speaker having to go back into Special Session. Changes have been made to the location of the October event now being held at the Petroleum Club.

**VP Legislative Affairs:** Maj Jim Cunningham, USA (Ret) – Jim provided a Voter Guide which will be distributed to the membership soon. There are two propositions affecting the military – Prop 7 exempts school taxes and Prop 8 exempts property taxes, as long as the spouse was 55 when their spouse passed away.

Both Kitty and Jim will be attending the MOAA annual meeting in Washington DC on Oct 15, Kitty to accept the Five Star Levels of Excellence award, and Jim to accept the same for the Texas Council of Chapters. Nothing currently happening regarding the Texas legislature.

MOAA is hosting a FEDVIP (Federal Employee Dental & Vision Insurance Program) enrollment webinar on Nov 2<sup>nd</sup>. Trish will send out email to the membership.

**President:** LtCol Kitty Meyers, USAF (Ret) – Had the opportunity to participate in the NCOA Golf Tournament along with Felix, David and Kathie. Ended up in last place but networking and making MOAA-AC visible was good!

Jim and Kitty are still working on the building lease, next step is to get an approved waiver on the building replacement insurance and utilities. Maj De Los Santos is assisting in that regard.

Thanked Lisa and Kathie for their hard work on the Big Give that resulted in \$6,453 worth of donations, including \$5000 from General Garza.

Solicitation letters for Operations and the Educational Foundation Fall Drive are being prepared and will be mailed soon.

The current Challenge Coin is not in compliance and need to be updated. Also, cannot present a coin to MOAA's VP Dan Merry at the next meeting because they also specifically say, along with JBSA Ft Sam Private Organizations department, that unless you have a license to use each one the military logos are copyrighted. Perhaps present a golf shirt instead. Need to have a redesign of the coin and any and all ideas are welcome.

#### Scorecard:

No change since the last meeting.

Priority One Updates: No changes for 1.1-1.3. 1.4 to include the luncheon held in August. 1.5 to include publication of Soldier's Angels events. 1.6 NRT reports are regularly being used to recruit new members. A report requested by MOAA national will be submitted towards the end of this month on our results using the NRT reports. 1.7 Amendments to the by laws allowing a new category of membership "Friends of the Chapter" has been approved by the Board. They are now pending membership approval at the November Annual Business meeting and then it will be forwarded to JBSA Private Orgs for their approval.

Will be asking Dan Merry to participate in the JBSA virtual Retiree Appreciation Day on Dec 11 10am-Noon with a 15 minute legislative update and asked Jim and Kitty to encourage him if they see him in Washington this weekend.

Hiring event at Red White & You on Dec 4 will be an opportunity to recruit – Felix to attend.

As an incentive for next year's action plan may want to offer incentive to bring in paid memberships (3?) and you get a year free? Kitty feels there may well be more opportunities in the new year now that all military will be required to be vaccinated and Bexar County vaccination rate is 80%+.

Priority Two Updates: 2.1 Advertising team is still intact and working leads. 2.2 Fund raising event to complement the Golf Tournament and raise monies for Operations still in the works. 2.3 50% likely to remain.2.4 goals have been met for the year. 2.5 and 2.6 ongoing 2.7 up to 75+ followers. 2.8 The Big Give was a great success. 2.9 is complete.

Priority Three Updates: Once redistricting has taken place will be recruiting new legislative team from the membership to visit the representatives.
